

PE and Sports Premium for Primary Schools 2017-18

Overview

The school has benefited from the PE and Sports Premium which has the aim of improving the provision of PE and sport; it is ring-fenced so that it can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in school.

Our aims when spending the PE and Sports Premium allocated to our school is to:

- Increase pupil participation in sport
- Improve the school staff's skills and expertise in delivering high quality sports teaching
- Increase pupils' achievement in sport (both in-class and when competing)
- Increase participation in a wider range of sports

For the academic year 2017-18, the school received £17,510. The funds have been spent in the following ways:

Year 6 swimming

The school provided the opportunity for children in Key Stage 2 to attend a week-long intensive programme for swimming. During that time, 55% of year 6 children who attended achieved a distance of 25 metres on their backs, 11% achieved a distance of 25 metres on their fronts, and all were able to:

- Submerge their body completely under water and surface to face the examiner without goggles;
- Demonstrate an understanding of the water safety code;
- To be able to identify dangerous locations.

Impact

- The school has competed in a range of events throughout the year, with children representing the school at athletics, cricket, netball, football and rounders.
- Children have engaged positively with the chess lessons and have developed their confidence and ability to think strategically.
- The work on the field will provide the children with a safe and flexible space within which to practice their sports skills into the future.
- Staff have developed enhanced confidence and capacity to deliver PE and sports at a high level in the future.
