The family ship things over on a fairly regular basis and have storage in the UK for items before they are sent. I think it would be great to be able to send things which families or schools could use. Of particular interest are:

These items will be shipped direct to people who need them with no middle-men taking commission or charging for these goods when they arrive.

If you are having a spring clean over the next couple of weeks, please consider donating things from this list through us. Please bag them up so that they can be stored and shipped, then drop them inside school at the Reception desk. We won't be able to use things which get wet/damp.
