**Maths Challenge Answers!**

Two positive whole numbers add up to 35 and equal 96 when they are multiplied together.

What is the sum of the squares of these two numbers?

**Answer is 1033**

A new retail outlet is to be built on a plot that is 30 metres wide and 75 metres deep. The retail space must be 600 m<sup>2</sup> and three-fifths of the whole plot must be used for customer parking.

How many square metres will be available to provide access, and other staff and customer facilities, on the remainder of the plot?

These items will be shipped direct to people who need them with no middle-men taking commission or charging for these goods when they arrive.

If you are having a spring clean over the next couple of weeks, please consider donating things from this list through us. Please bag them up so that they can be stored and shipped, then drop them inside school at the Reception desk. We won't be able to use things which get wet/damp.
