Diarrhoea and Vomiting Illness

This week we have had an increase in the number of children with symptoms of diarrhoea and vomiting illness. Please remember that if your child has a bout of diarrhoea and/or vomiting, they should not return to school until 48 hours after the final episode, even if there is only one bout of illness. If your child returns to school before the 48 hours has passed you will be asked to come and collect them to prevent the potential risk of spreading infection.

Medication

A reminder that all medicines should be brought into school by an adult and handed to the office. There is a form which needs to be completed giving details of the medicine, dosage and your signed consent for us to administer the medicine to your child. Medicines should be collected by an adult at the end of the day.

Suncream

We would encourage you to apply suncream to your child/children before they come into school. However, if you do wish to send suncream into school please ensure that it is clearly labelled with your child's name and handed in to the office or class teacher. Thank you for your cooperation.
