Diarrhoea and Vomiting Illness

Thanks for supporting us with this - we have now had a lot less children off ill. However, please remember that if you child has a bout of diarrhoea and/or vomiting, they should not return to school until 48 hours after the final episode, even if there is only one bout of illness. If your child returns to school before the 48 hours has passed you will be asked to come and collect them to prevent the potential risk of spreading infection.

Medication

A reminder that all medicines should be brought into school by an adult and handed to the office. There is a form which needs to be completed giving details of the medicine, dosage and your signed consent for us to administer the medicine to your child. Medicines should be collected by an adult at the end of the day.

Sun Cream

We would encourage you to apply sun cream to your child/children before they come into school. However, if you do wish to send sun cream into school please ensure that it is clearly labelled with your child's name and handed in to the office or class teacher. Thank you for your cooperation.

Updating Your Contact Information

A reminder to please update us with any changes in your contact details. It is important that we have the correct address and telephone numbers for you and also up-to-date telephone numbers for any other people that are listed on your child's data collection sheet. Please let the office know if you need to amend any of the information that we currently hold for you.
